Suggested Materials for this class are

Example:

Watercolor paper. Prepare sheets 11"x15" (1/4 full sheet) or 15"x22" (1/2 full sheet) or a block of paper. Please buy **arches** or similar quality

A masonite board to tape down your paper and carry it as well (available for a few dollars at any art store)

Masking tape 3/4"

Paper towels

Brushes 3 sizes should do

A palette

Some extra color (those you use most)

Small sketchbook

Pen and a few colored pencils

Water bottle 2 any quality

Watercolor style easel

Collapsible chair or inflatable cushion sometimes very appreciated.

Locations

Week 1 September 12

Dover The Charles Beginnings

We will meet at the Kaji Aso Studio at 9:45 and car pool to our location which is Grove Park in Dover.

The narrow Charles is running under an old stone bridge.

Surrounded by farms and parks.

Week 2 September 19

Mansfield

We will meet at the Kaji Aso Studio at 9:45 and car pool to our location which is in Dedham. Here the Charles winds through treeless marshes and open plains.
